BULKY ITEMS COLLECTION

The second Monday of the month
Last Pick-up – November 14, 2016

We wish to remind you that each household can put out a maximum of **TEN items** weighing no more than 100 kg (220 lbs) each, and measuring no more than 1.8 m x 1.2 m (6 ft x 4 ft). Please refer to the list of accepted bulky items below or consult your *Recycling Collection User Guide* for all details.



LIST OF ACCEPTED BULKY ITEMS:

- Hot water tanks;
- Electrical household appliances (except those containing refrigeration gas);
- Bathtubs, toilets, sinks;
- Non-upholstered furniture made of wood, metal or plastic (tables, chairs, desks, dressers, etc.);
- Propane barbecue grills (without the propane tank);
- A few pieces of wood;
- Pool covers (only rolled);
- Mirrors, glass panes and old windows;
- Electric baseboard heaters, kitchen range hoods;
- Electrical metal appliances of all sizes;
- Large household items.

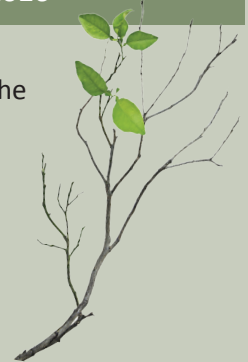
In order to ensure the safety of those performing the bulky items collection, it is recommended to secure all items by removing any cutting edges or objects containing
